Mentors play a critical role in our society. Too often, managers may be reluctant to take on this role. **Alex Malley,** chief executive officer of the multinational organization CPA Australia, author of the bestselling book The Naked CEO and host of the leadership television series The Bottom Line offers five guiding principles to the budding mentor. His insights are as relevant to Toastmasters as they are in the business world.

- You do not need to know all the answers. The role of the mentor is to provoke the individual into thinking.
- Ask the right questions. Asking considered questions can help encourage the individual to think differently about issues.
- Avoid over-mentoring. Don't be part of a stable of mentors or be too accessible.
- Do not be afraid to share anecdotal advice. Sharing insights on common experiences and challenges can help build a real bond.
- *Mentoring is not the same as managing.* It's important for a mentor to create a relationship grounded in independence.
